**Scouting Ball State:** The Cardinals are coming off of a 75-69 exhibition win over the Hoosier Lady Stars. Ball State had four players score in double digits Friday night. Danielle Gratton scored 22 points and was perfect from three-point range going 4-for-4 from behind the arc. Emily Maggert recorded 14 points while teammates Audrey McDonald managed 11 points and Kiley Jarrett ended the night with 10. The Cardinals are the two-time defending Mid-American Conference West Division Champions who begin a new era under the direction of head coach Kelly Packard. Ball State ended the 2007-08 season with an overall record of 15-15 and went 11-5 in league play. For just the second time in program history, the Ball State women's basketball team has been invited to play in the Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament. The last time the Cardinals participated in the preseason WNIT was in 2002-03. The Cardinals lost to No. 15 Kansas, 71-61.

**Scouting Indiana:** Indiana has played two exhibition games with wins over Southern Indiana (93-49) and Indianapolis (82-56). In its first exhibition game win over Southern Indiana, three Hoosiers scored in double digits. Guard Haylie Linn led the team with 16 points. Guards Jori Davis netted 15 points and Kim Roberson had 11. IU ended exhibition action with a victory over Indianapolis. Four Hoosiers managed to reach double digits with Davis leading the pack with 19. Forward Whitney Thomas had 18 points, Roberson ended the night with 14 and forward Amber Jackson scored 10. The Hoosiers ended the 2007-08 season with an overall record of 18-15 and finished 10-8 in the Big Ten Conference to tie for fifth place. Indiana's invitation to the preseason event marks the first since the 1998-99 season when the Hoosiers went 2-2 with wins over Cincinnati (Nov. 13; 61-51) and Missouri State (Nov. 15; 63-60), before falling to Rutgers in the third round, 60-53, on Nov. 19. The Hoosiers then lost to Florida in the consolation game, 72-67, on Nov. 20.

# 2008-09 BALL STATE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

**Season Openers:** The game at Indiana marks Ball State's 35th season opener in the history of the women's basketball program. The Cardinals are 16-18 all-time in openers. Last season Ball State fell to No. 21/23 Louisville at Worthen Arena, 81-62. Prior to last year the Cardinals had won three straight season openers including a 62-58 Big Ten victory over Michigan in 2006-07. BSU will be opening on the road for just the 12th time in program history. Ball State is 6-5 in road season openers.

**Series History:** Tonight's game is the 27th meeting all-time between Ball State and Indiana. The Cardinals trail the all-time series record 23-3, including losses in the past 18 meetings. The last time these two team's met was last season at Worthen Arena. Ball State lost to the Hoosiers 76-71. Last year the Cardinals came out of the gate at the start as a team on a mission.

**2007-08 IU vs. Ball State Recap:** The two teams battled for the first five minutes to a 13-13 score until the Cardinals stormed out to a double-digit lead. Ball State ran off nine straight points on its way to a 20-4 run as it took a 33-17 lead with 6:38 left in the first half. Junior guard Porchia Green started the run with a basket in transition. Sophomore guard Audrey McDonald capped the 9-0 run and forced an Indiana timeout with a three-pointer from the corner. After a pair of DeMuth baskets, junior guard Kiley Jarrett scored seven quick points to give the Cardinals a 16-point lead. Jarrett capped the run with a three-pointer to force another Indiana timeout. Ball State opened the game hitting 13 out of its first 15 shots from the field to jump out to the early lead. Indiana regrouped in the timeout as the Hoosiers responded with a 19-5 run down the stretch to head into the locker room trailing by only two points at 38-36. Indiana's run to close the half was spurred by the Hoosiers' three-point shooting as they connected on five-of-nine (55.6 percent) from long range in the opening half. Ball State finished the first half 16-of-23 (69.6 percent) shooting from the field, including three-of-six (50 percent) from three-point land. All five starters for the Cardinals scored at least five points in the first half with DeMuth pacing the attack with nine points. Indiana connected on 58.3 percent (14-of-24) from the field in the first half as guard Jamie Braun led all first half scorers with 12 points. The two teams came out of halftime and battled back-and-forth over the first four minutes with Indiana taking a slim 44-42 lead. The Cardinals responded to the deficit and ran off a quick 7-1 spurt to take a 49-45 lead and force another Indiana timeout. Jarrett keyed the run with another three-pointer, while freshman Emily Maggett added a basket in transition. Indiana had an answer though as it turned in a 9-1 lead to take back the lead for good at 54-50. Ball State pulled back within one, but Indiana got a four-point play from Kim Roberson to stretch the lead back to five with five minutes remaining. The Hoosiers extended their lead to 69-59 with 1:24 remaining in the game. Ball State had one last push at the lead as the Cardinals made it a one possession game in the final minute. Green ignited the late game charge with a three-pointer, while senior forward Lisa Rusche added a pair of baskets before the rally fell short. The Cardinals finished the night shooting 54.9 percent (28-of-51) from the field, including five-of-13 (38.5 percent) from three-point land. Indiana equaled the Cardinals' strong shooting night as the Hoosiers finished 51.9 percent (28-of-54) from the field and were just as strong from long range as they hit eight-of-16 (50 percent). Green finished the night with 13 points as she was five-of-eight from the field and a perfect two-of-two from three-point land. Rusche added 12 points, six rebounds, three assists, two blocks and four steals in the losing effort. Jarrett scored 10 points as she was four-of-five shooting from the field in 38 minutes of action. Indiana was paced by Braun who finished with 24 points as she was nine-of-18 from the field. Roberson added 15 points off of the bench and Nikki Smith chipped in 14 points as all three players combined for eight three-pointers.

**About the WNIT:** Oklahoma and North Carolina headline the Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament, which kicks off the women's college basketball season Friday. Oklahoma, ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press Top 25 preseason poll, and North Carolina, ranked No. 6, are among numerous nationally-recognized teams in the WNIT, which is celebrating its 15th year. Oklahoma, voted in the preseason to win the Big 12 Conference, welcomes back four starters from its 22-9 team, including unanimous AP All-American pick Courtney Paris. Paris averaged 18.6 points and 15.0 rebounds per game and is just the sixth player in the 15-year history of the AP preseason team to be a unanimous choice. North Carolina, picked to capture the ACC, has three starters back from its 33-3 squad. The Tar Heels became the fifth program in NCAA history to win at least 30 games in four or more consecutive seasons. First-round games in the WNIT begin Friday for the bulk of the 16-team field. Second-round games will be played Nov. 16-19; semifinals Nov. 19-21; consolation games Nov. 20-23; and the championship is set for Sunday, Nov. 23. All games are played on home campuses, which are determined after the previous round. Teams are guaranteed to play at least three games. The Preseason WNIT field includes 12 teams that played in the a year ago, highlighted by North Carolina's Elite Eight showing. Arizona State, Cleveland State, Illinois State, Liberty, Oklahoma, Robert Morris, and Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament. Indiana, Middle Tennessee, VCU, and Western Carolina earned berths in the Postseason WNIT field. They will be joined by Ball State, Lafayette, Tulane, and UC Riverside in this fall's Preseason WNIT. In last year's Preseason WNIT, No. 3 Maryland defeated No. 4 LSU and went on to a 33-4 season, advancing to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight. LSU went to the Final Four.

**Ball State vs. the Big Ten:** The Cardinals have faced off against eight of the 11 Big Ten teams in program history and own an 18-50 mark all-time against those teams. The Cardinals posted an 0-1 record last season against Big Ten teams. The last time Ball State defeated a Big Ten team was in 2006-07 when it defeated Michigan, 62-58.

**Green and Maggert Named Preseason All-MAC:** Ball State senior guard Porchia Green (Indianapolis, Ind./Arlington) and sophomore forward Emily Maggert (Paris, Ill./Paris) were named to the preseason All-Mid-American Conference West Division team, the league office announced in October. Green garnered First Team All-MAC honors in 2007-08, helping her team to the MAC West Division titles for the fourth time in school history. Green led the team in scoring averaging 13.0 points a contest and in rebounding pulling down 6.9 boards per game. She started all 30 games for the Cardinals last season. Green ranks 17th all-time in Cardinals history with 467 rebounds, 11th all-time in career assists with 277, 11th in career steals with 142 and tied for ninth in blocked shots at 53. Maggert was named to the All-MAC Freshman team and earned the MAC's Sixth Player of the Year, the first Cardinal all-time to earn the postseason accolade. As a true freshman, Maggert saw action in all 30 games, while averaging 12.1 points per game against league opponents and was second in the MAC in shooting at 59.1 percent (78-132). Maggert's 274 points are the eighth most in a single season for a Ball State freshman.

**Ball State Tabbed MAC West Division Favorite:** The Ball State women's basketball team has been tabbed the 2008-09 preseason favorite to win the Mid-American Conference West Division. The Cardinals were picked to win the MAC West for the third straight season with 129 votes. Northern Illinois was chosen to finish behind Ball State with 89. Central Michigan (76) and Western Michigan (75) were picked to finish third and fourth, respectively, while Eastern Michigan (51) and Toledo (47) round out the division. In the East Division Bowling Green was picked to finish first and was chosen to win the MAC Tournament Championship. Ball State heads into the 2008-09 season after earning the fourth MAC West Division title in program history in 2007-08, accompanied by a 15-15 overall record and a 11-5 mark in conference play. They return seven letterwinners from last year's squad including First Team All-MAC recipient senior guard Porchia Green and sophomore forward Emily Maggert who garnered last year's MAC Sixth Player of the Year award. The Cardinals begin a new era under the direction of head coach Kelly Packard this season. In addition for just the second time in program history, the Ball State women's basketball team has been invited to play in the 2008 Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament. The Cardinals will open their season at Indiana, Nov. 14 at 7 p.m. in preseason WNIT play.

**Cardinals Schedule:** After the Preseason WNIT, the Cardinals will travel to Illinois State Tuesday, Nov. 25, for a 7 p.m. tip-off. Then Ball State will return to Worthen Arena for its home opener against Evansville Friday, Dec. 5, at 7 p.m. The Cardinals head back on the road Dec. 7, to play Louisville. Ball State will host Wright State (Dec. 10) and Indiana State (Dec. 13) before traveling to Western Kentucky Dec. 20. Ball State hosts Temple Dec. 22, before rounding out non-conference play with trips to the Alabama Tournament (Dec. 29-30) and St. Louis (Jan. 4). The Cardinals last non conference game will be at home against North Dakota in the middle of league play Jan. 27. Ball State will take on Eastern Michigan at home Wednesday, Jan. 7, for its MAC opener, and the Cardinals will close league play on the road at Toledo Saturday, March 7.

"The Preseason WNIT is a great opportunity for our program," said Packard. "The tournament environment and the regionals match-up against IU present a great way to begin this season. The test of the tournament play for our freshman is irreplaceable."

**About Packard:** Kelly Packard, the former head coach of the Colorado Chill of the National Women's Basketball League (NWBL) and a long-time assistant at Colorado State, has been named the 10th head women's basketball coach in Ball State University history, according to BSU athletics director Tom Collins.

Packard was previously the executive director of the WNBA Expansion Team for Colorado, working for Triple Crown Sports. She spent two seasons as the head coach of the Colorado Chill (2004-06) of the NWBL.

During her tenure, the Chill posted a 34-12 overall record while claiming the 2005 and 2006 league championships. She was the team's general manager in the 2006 season and compiled a roster that included five WNBA players, including All-Stars Becky Hammon and Ruth Riley.

Packard's collegiate experience covers five seasons over two stints at Colorado State University where she worked for Tom Collen (currently at Arkansas) and Greg Williams (currently at Rice). During her five seasons, the Rams saw unprecedented success as they posted a 99-49 overall record and appeared in two NCAA Tournaments.

She was part of the staff that guided CSU to a 33-3 record in the 1998-99 season as the Rams claimed a No. 5 national ranking, a WAC Mountain Division title and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament including a run to the Sweet 16 while an assistant coach at Colorado State.

She also was part of the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) selection committee and a site coordinator. She was the head coach of the 2006 Athletes in Action Brazil Women's Basketball Tour where she guided her team to a 7-1 record.

Packard was a four-year letterwinner at Anderson and was inducted to the Anderson University Hall of Fame in 2002. She was a four-time All-Hoosier Conference for Women selection and ended her career as the school's all-time leading scorer and rebounder. She earned her degree in mass communications in 1990.

Packard and her husband Rich have two children, Derek (14) and Evan (10).

"I couldn't be more pleased to welcome Kelly, her husband Rich, and their two sons to the Ball State family," Ball State University President Dr. Jo Ann M. Gora said. "Kelly brings an impressive array of coaching experience from a NCAA Division I team to the NWBL. At the international level she also coached the Brazilian Women's Athletes in Action team. She's been part of winning programs in each of these arenas including a

run to the Sweet 16 while an assistant coach at Colorado State. I know this was a difficult search because we had so many talented applicants. Kelly's track record of success combined with her strong Indiana ties make her a great fit for building upon the strengths of our Women's Basketball program."

**Packard Retains Lisa McDonald:** McDonald is in her eighth year as part of Ball State women's basketball and begins her first season alongside first year head coach Kelly Packard. McDonald remains as associate head coach for a fourth season. She has been a part of the women's basketball staff since being hired in July 2001. McDonald coached the Cardinals in the final 20 games of the 2007-08 season to a 12-8 record and an 11-5 mark in the Mid-American Conference as acting head coach.

**Packard Hires Carter Shaw and Lindsay Shade:** Shaw enters his first year with the Cardinals. He has seen his team qualify for post-season play in each of the eleven seasons he has served as a Division I assistant in women's basketball coach. Most recently Shaw was an assistant coach at UC Santa Barbara for the last six seasons. He is a 2000 Utah graduate.

Shade enters her first season with women's basketball and comes to Ball State after spending 2006-08 at the College of Holy Cross as an assistant. Shade was also at the University of Pittsburgh from 2004-06. She was a member of the women's basketball team at her alma mater, Davidson where she earned her bachelor's in 2004.

**Corbin Remains Director of Basketball Operations:**

Kelsey Corbin, a four-year standout for the Cardinals, begins her second season as Director of Basketball Operations under head coach Kelly Packard. Corbin joined the staff on August 1, 2007. Corbin finished her career with the Cardinals in which she became the first player in Ball State women's basketball history to score 1,000 career points, grab 400 career rebounds and dish out 400 career assists. She also finished her career fifth all-time in career games played at 117 and fourth all-time in career assists at 435.
